In the cross-circulation experiment of October 7th, 1892, chloroform was administered to the fed and carried to the fed's heart only and not to its brain. The tracing of this experiment shows that concentrated chloroform inhaled in the most rapid manner possible and conveyed to the heart only did not produce anaesthesia, or failure of the respiration, or fall of blood pressure; in fact it produced no effect on the animal of any kind. Taken together the two experiments complete and terminate the work of the Hyderabad Commission. They prove that chloroform has no direct action whatever on the heart, and consequently that the fall of blood pressure caused by the administration of chloroform is not due primarily or in any direct manner to a weakening of the heart's action.
