Cheney, and Farnum White, Jun., who were charged in the indictment with a conspiracy to defraud Olivia Eames of Holden, of the voluntary services of her servant girl, named Anne, without her consent, - came on in the Court of Common Pleas, in this town, (Worcester) on Tuesday, January 29th, 1839, Judge Strong presiding. Pliny Merrick, Esq., District Attorney, conducted the prosecution; and Charles Allen, Esq., appeared for the defendants. Mr. Merrick, in opening the case, stated that Mrs. Eames, the party aggrieved, was a native of Worcester County - that she was married to Mr. Eames, also a native of this County, who a few years since removed with her to New Orleans. There he acquired some property, and, among other articles, came in possession of a number of slaves. In 1837, he died; after which, Mrs. Eames sold her...
